PUBLIC NOTICE OF REISSUANCE OF A UPDES PERMIT

**PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE**

THE PURPOSE OF THIS PUBLIC NOTICE IS TO DECLARE THE STATE OF UTAH'S INTENTION TO REISSUE A UTAH POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (UPDES) PERMIT UNDER AUTHORITY OF THE UTAH WATER QUALITY ACT, SECTION 19-5-106 AND 107, UTAH CODE ANNOTATED 1953, AS AMENDED. SAID "PERMIT" REFERS TO UPDES PERMIT AND THE STATEMENT OF BASIS (INCLUDING THE TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOADS (TMDL'S)) IF APPLICABLE, AS PER SECTION 303 (d) OF THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT (CWA).

**BACKGROUND**

The Hyrum City Wastewater Treatment Plant (HWTP) serves the City of Hyrum with a population of approximately 7,200 and is located in Cache County. The HWTP utilizes a membrane bioreactor treatment (MBR) process and consists of screening, two parallel anoxic basins, an aerated channel, three aeration basins and membrane filtration followed by ultraviolet disinfection.

During the non-irrigation season, the final effluent is discharged to an unnamed ditch which flows to Spring Creek and then to the Little Bear River. During the irrigation season, effluent from the HWTP is reused in the City's irrigation system.
