- had a Severity Level I, II, or III Violation of Radiation Control regulations; or,
- any equivalent violation of any State, federal, or local environmental regulation in the past year; and, you have not

- had a total of three such violations in the past three years;
- have not had any criminal violation of environmental regulations for the past five years and currently are not the focus of an environmental criminal investigation; and,
- have no other open or unresolved violation(s).

### Terms and Conditions

Acceptance as a Clean Utah Bronze Level participant entitles the facility to technical assistance, if needed, to determine an appropriate environmental improvement project and the metrics to be used to measure the environmental improvements. Bronze Level participants will be recognized on the DEQ Web site and other media as a business who is participating in the Clean Utah program.

Acceptance as a Clean Utah Silver Level participant entitles the facility to technical assistance in developing an EMS and recognition on the DEQ Web site and other publicity as one who is interested in and has started the Clean Utah process. Applications are accepted at any time and will be reviewed on a semi-annual basis.

Each Clean Utah Silver Level participant will develop and implement an Environmental Management System (EMS). Several EMS models currently exist, including ISO-14001, and the applicant is free to select the model which best meets the facility's circumstances. Any model selected must include each of the 12 components outlined in the Clean Utah policy (available online at [www.deq.utah.gov/cleanutah](http://www.deq.utah.gov/cleanutah)).

To remain in the program, an EMS must be completed and operational within two years of being accepted into the program. Those who desire to move onto the Gold Level must document that the EMS has been implemented for one full cycle. In addition, two projects designed to significantly reduce or prevent pollution must be proposed. Ideally, these projects should be based on aspects identified in the EMS process (additional information is available online).

Clean Utah participants agree to remain in compliance with applicable environmental regulations. Failure to do so may be grounds for removal.

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

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
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## ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Utah Food Services has very extensive recycling programs at its Salt Lake and Sandy locations and plans to expand this to its North Salt Lake facility. Since March of 2009 thru March of 2011 at these two locations we have recycled just over 22 tons of mixed recyclables. By adding our North Salt Lake facility we will increase our mixed recyclables being recycled by 20% equal to 2.2 tons per year.

Utah Food Services will begin to recycle all <sup>1</sup>Mixed Recyclables at its North Salt Lake facility starting April 1<sup>st</sup> 2011. Using an 8yd recycling container to be emptied when full, this will give us the ability to measure the Volume (yrds<sup>3</sup>) and <sup>2</sup>Total Weight (lbs) of our mixed recyclables. The billing records from our recycling company Ace Disposal will show how often the container is emptied. With this information we will be able to create a landfill Diversion Chart.

<sup>1</sup>Mixed Recyclables: All office paper, books and magazines. All plastics 1 – 7 plastic grocery bags, water bottles and laundry jugs. All cardboard, milk and juice cartons. All metals, steel, tin and aluminum cans.

<sup>2</sup>Approximate weight based on average weight of container. These averages are based on EPA guidelines and Momentum Recycling figures derived from Rocky Mountain Recycling Facility weigh-ins.
